

## Keokuk County Board Proceedings

### KEOKUK COUNTY BOARD PROCEEDINGS OCTOBER 2, 2017

The Keokuk County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, Monday, October 2, 2017 in the Board Room of the Courthouse. All members were present.

Wood moved, Berg seconded to approve the agenda. All ayes and motion carried.

Berg moved, Wood seconded to approve the minutes of September 25, 2017 as submitted. All ayes and motion carried.

Met with Engineer McGuire regarding Keokuk County Highway Department. Jim Conger entered to share his various frustrations regarding quarry trucks.

Berg moved, Wood seconded approval of award of contract for Project Number HSIP-S-CO54(111)-6C-54 clearing on W15 to Greiner, Trent Logging, LLC - \$78,800, low bid, as submitted. All ayes and motion carried. Bids received: Seaton Construction, Inc. - \$93,820; Brown's Tree Service, LLC - \$122,270; Homer Tree Service, Inc. - \$200,500; Jasper Construction Services, Inc. - \$202,200; Lodge Construction Inc. - \$253,800; Minturn, Inc. - \$307,450; Iowa Civil Contracting, Inc. - \$319,308.51 and Cornerstone Excavating, Inc. & Subsidiary - \$391,850.

Public hearing for the vacation of a portion of 260th Avenue being located within Sections 10 and 11, Township 76 North, Range 11 West and described as follows: all that part of 260th Avenue from a point 1420.00 feet north of the southwest corner of Section 11, T-76-N, R-11-W south to the north right of way line of 180th Street was held. Randy Holtzinger and Ron Snakenberg, adjacent landowners, were present. No oral or written objections were received. Mick moved, Wood seconded to close said public hearing. All ayes and the public hearing closed at 9:19 a.m.

Possible approval of resolution regarding vacation of a portion of 260th Avenue being located within Sections 10 and 11, Township 76 North, Range 11 West and described as follows: all that part of 260th Avenue from a point 1420.00 feet north of the southwest corner of Section 11, T-76-N, R-11-W south to the north right of way line of 180th Street was held. No action was taken. Consensus was to place a dead end sign in said location.

Berg moved, Wood seconded to approve the October 2, 2017 claim listing as submitted. All ayes and motion carried.

Wood moved, Berg seconded to approve letter of support and resolution approving application to Washington County Riverboat Foundation for Fire Prevention

& Training Project as submitted. All ayes and motion carried.

Berg moved, Wood seconded approval of quarterly interfund operating transfer from Rural Services Fund (\$341,250), General Basic Fund (\$25,000) & LOST Fund (\$75,000) to Secondary Road Fund totaling \$441,250 as submitted. All ayes and motion carried.

Wood moved, Berg seconded to approve certification of expenses for September 12, 2017, Keokuk County School Elections as submitted. All ayes and motion carried.

Various board and committee reports were held. Wood participated in a Pathfinders conference call and attended 10-15 Transit and Regional Planning Area 15 meetings. Berg had no meetings to attend but accompanied Engineer McGuire to look at county maintenance facilities in Monroe and Mahaska Counties. Hadley attended Sieda, Board of Health and Area 15 meetings last week.

Discussion of old/new business and public comment was held. Pathfinders distributed an update for September happenings. Bates shared an email received from Sigourney Fire Chief regarding request for reimbursement of body recovery fees for review and a phone conversation regarding parcel WCCOT 000500.

On vote and motion the meeting adjourned at 10:00 a.m.
